General elections are every November. Polls are open 6:00 AM to 7:00 PM. If you are unsure of the name of your precinct (the district where you live) or your polling place for that district (where you vote), go to the [Virginia State Board of Elections WEB](#) at <http://elections.virginia.gov/> to enter your address and find where you vote. Other voting information is available from the web site or you can contact the State Board of Elections at (804)864-8901 [toll free (800)552-9745]. Questions can also be directed to your local Voter Registrar.

Be sure to bring a [Photo ID](#) on one of the following valid cards:

- Virginia Driver's License or ID Card
- Virginia DMV issued Veteran's ID card
- United States Passport
- Other government-issued photo ID cards (must be issued by US Government, the Commonwealth of Virginia, or a political body of the Commonwealth)
- Tribal enrollment or other tribal ID issued by one of 11 tribes recognized by the Commonwealth of Virginia
- College or university student photo ID card from a school of higher education located in Virginia
- Employee ID card containing a photograph of the voter and issued by an employer of the voter in the ordinary course of the employer's business

General Voting Information for Virginians

Upcoming Elections

Primary Election – Tuesday June 12

Last Day to register – Monday May 14

General Election – Tuesday November 6

Last Day to register – Monday October 15

✓ Who can vote?

Any United States citizen, living in Virginia, not a convicted felon or is a felon with voting rights restored, has not been judged mentally incapacitated, and will be 18 years old on or before the general election may register and vote.
